Mijwan Welfare Society, a stalwart in the realm of social development, has been actively engaged in empowering communities for the past three decades. Anchored by the philosophy of "Empower One and Empower All," the society has embarked on the Samridhi Project, a dedicated initiative focused on women's empowerment.

the Samridhi Project emerged with a distinct focus on **sustainable employability** for rural women, girls, and artisans. Unlike traditional approaches, Samridhi goes beyond mere employment, incorporating a holistic model that encompasses training, skill development, product innovation, Equipment facilitations and overall well-being.

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SAMRIDHI PROJECT (PHASE-3) : OVERVIEW

In its third phase, the Samridhi Saksham Project transcends mere project status; it evolves into a holistic strategy committed to establishing a sustainable ecosystem for rural women artisans. With a synergistic blend of skill development, market access, and entrepreneurial support, this initiative seeks to reshape the narrative of women empowerment within the rural landscape.

EQUIPMENT FACILITATION : SAMRIDHI SAKSHAM SUPPORT

The project's needs were meticulously assessed from both market and artsan's perspectives for impactful outcomes.

Recognizing the advancements in technology by the year 2023, the project aimed to **upgrade artisans' lives with the latest trends and technology** to ensure sustained empowerment.

Artisans (enrolled-2023) requirements were identified through years experience with at Mijwan Welfare Society, Mijwan, Azamgarh and Samridhi Centre, Ambedkar Nagar. Challenges, particularly in **financial conditions hindering entrepreneurship**, were observed.

The selection process began with a comprehensive project meeting where all members collaborated to strategize and outline the execution plan.

Recognizing challenges in managing heavy-weight sewing machines, particularly during periods when using foot pedals can be cumbersome, the team collectively opted for an automatic electronic sewing machine with a lightweight design. The selected model is outlined below.

FORMS AND FORMAT:

The selection format was authentically improvised, fortified with **supporting documents** and details of two guarantors.

BACKGROUND CHECK:

Candidatures underwent **verification** by trainers and community mobilizers. Supporting documents, such as income certificates and ration cards, along with details of two local guarantors, were scrutinized to **authenticate the candidates' background**.







INTERVIEW PROCESS:

A three-day interview was conducted at Samriddhi Centre, Ambedkar Nagar, and Mijwan Welfare Society, Mijwan. The interview panel comprised members, including mr. Ashutosh Ji (Manager), mr. Suneel Ji (Manager), mrs. Sanyogita Ji (Centre in- charge), Mr. Rampher ji, community mobilizers, and relevant center staff.

SELECTION CRITERIA:

Candidates were evaluated based on work commitment, dedication, financial conditions, and family background and support.







INTERVIEW RESULT:

A follow-up meeting was convened to deliberate on the distribution plans and preparations. Topics covered included the screening of chosen candidates and the review of feedback. The distribution date was officially set for December 20, 2023, with specified guests scheduled to participate in the distribution process.
